About Ayusa World Leaders

World Leaders is a three-week summer leadership experience that enables promising young people from around the world to connect with one another, share ideas and participate in seminars and activities centered on global leadership.

Program Location

The World Leaders programs take place on the college campus of the University of California, Berkeley, in the San Francisco Bay Area. Students live on campus in the UC Berkeley residence halls for the duration of the program.

Eligibility

World Leaders is open to high school aged students from the U.S. and around the world.

Requirements for High School Students

U.S high school students

- Must be between the ages of 15 and 18 years old by the program start date
- Must have a minimum GPA of 3.5 (on a 4.0 scale)

International high school students

- Must be between the ages of 15 and 18 years old by the program state date
- Must have a SLEP score of 55 points or higher

Curriculum

The 2011 World Leader's offers students the opportunity to study Environmental Leadership. The World Leaders curriculum combines project-based learning and youth engagement with topics and themes pulled from college level AP Environmental Science coursework. Through renowned guest speakers, class discussions and relevant field trips, this course will explore three important topics affecting the environment today: Global Warming/Climate Change, Environmental Design, and Human Population. At the conclusion of the Ayusa World Leaders program, all students will have the opportunity to showcase an environmentally-focused project of their choosing to government officials in the State Capitol.

Typical Day

Students attend classroom instruction in the mornings, then either attend a guest lecture, volunteer in a service project, participate in team-building activities or visit sites in or around the San Francisco Bay Area in the afternoon. In the evenings there will be organized social activities such as dances, movies, etc. On the weekends students will take part in cultural excursions as a group.
